Minutes of the Fourth Quarter Chapter Meeting

Mr. Mills designed many of today's most graceful and long-standing buildings and churches in Charleston, Philadelphia, Baltimore, and Washington, D.C. among others. His architecture was intended to enhance the purpose of the structure, such as special features to enhance sound and visibility. He was also an early advocate of fireproof design; an example of which is the "Fireproof Building" in Charleston, which he designed. The club expressed their appreciation to Mr. Davies with a round of applause and an SAR "Certificate of appreciation".

Three new members were then installed and welcomed into the chapter. The new members are Michael Kelley, Rob Pollard, and Christian Tootle.

SCSSAR President Cousar then installed new chapter officers for the upcoming year, those being Frank Gibson as Vice President, and Paul Steele as Secretary.

Chapter President Dinkins then presented Capt. Dean Hewitt, USN Ret, with the Korean War Service Veterans Corps certificate; and compatriot Carroll Crowther presented Color Sgt. Michael Keyserling with a streamer for the chapter flag in recognition of chapter participation in the Battle of Eutaw Springs 235th anniversary service in September.

There being no further new or old business, the meeting was gaveled to a close.
