President Michael Monahan presented the SAR War Service Medal to Colonel David Mills, USMC, for Special Operations Service, and service in Iraq and Afghanistan, to Harold Wayne Cousar for U.S. Air Force service in Vietnam, and to Bradford Wayne Cousar for GA Air National Guard SW Asia/Afghanistan service. James P. Atkins was presented the SAR 5 Year Membership Award.

Secretary Harold Mills introduced his son, Col David Mills, USMC the guest speaker for the evening as a family man, good son and dedicated Marine.

Col Mills described with color slides and photos his service from early August to late December 2021 in establishing and operating the Afghan Refugee Camp of 5,000 refugees at Marine Base Quantico, Virginia.

He related with pride how the young Marines interacted with the afghans which was inspirational. David also offered his observation that today's young Marines are people of action like previous generations and would respond to any challenge and complete their mission.
